



Every contestant must be a member of the Slovak Catholic Sokol in good standing for at least one (1) year or three (3) 1. months with Single Premium Life Insurance.

2. (A) The golf tournament will consist of *seven* flights as listed below before applying 75% handicap:

> "A" Flight 0 -12 handicap

"S" Senior Flight 62-69 years old

"B" Flight 13-20 handicap

"SS" Super Senior 70 and over

"C" Flight 21 and over handicap

"W" Fliaht Women, Callaway System

"D" Flight Callaway System

Maximum Handicap per round: Men – 40 & Women - 50 (B)

- (C) Only the Slovak Catholic Sokol /GCU Handicap will be accepted for all flights.
- 3. The tournament will be held with prevailing U.S.G.A. rules.
- 4. Callaway Flights: Golfers who do not have a handicap (handicaps are determined after two years or four rounds) of Tournament play. The Callaway Modified System will be used with two blind holes each round to calculate the daily handicap.
- All handicaps are subject to review and possible re-rating by "Handicap Committee". In the case of ties, lowest 5. (A) handicap will be declared flight winner.
 - (B) Women golfers will compete in a separate flight with a Modified Callaway System.
- 6. All play will be 36 holes:

Friday, August 9 Practice Round (call the course directly to book your own tee time)

Saturday and Sunday, August 10-11 18 holes each day (tournament play)

- 7. Entry Fee is \$20.00 and Tournament Expense is \$20.00.
- 8. Both Friday evening hospitality and Saturday evening reception will be held at the Silver Course Pavilion at Treasure Lake from 5:00 - 7:00 PM. Mass will be celebrated at 4:00PM on Saturday at the Silver Pavilion. Reception immediately following.
- Prizes: There will be a Champion in each flight and the prize money will be awarded according to the number of entries 9. received for each flight.
- 10. Foursomes will be paired at the discretion of the tournament committee. Participants wishing for special twosomes & foursomes, please indicate your golf partners on the golf tournament application.
- Penalty for being tardy at the starting tee will be according to U.S.G.A. rules with loss of position. 11.

2024 Annual Supreme Physical Fitness Board Recommendations April 6, 2024

- 6. Recommend an allotment of \$300 for a digital frame to scan all the memorial photos that were received.
- Recommend an allotment of \$1500 to cover a Saturday night hospitality at the Family Fun Fest Weekend. (TABLED UNTIL WE HAVE A COUNT OF PARTICIPANTS)
- 8. Recommend an allotment, not to exceed \$1000, to cover the cost of gift cards to send to directors and directresses / assistants that attend the virtual clinic.
- Recommend an allotment of \$1000 to cover the cost of a computer and printer for the Director of Sports and Athletics.
- Recommend an allotment of \$1000 to cover the cost of miscellaneous. supplies/ prizes needed for any additional events organized by the SPFB.

After a lively discussion regarding all the items and recommen-

dations, General Counsel, John D. Pogorelec, Jr., Esq., moved for the acceptance of the report, seconded by Supreme Treasurer, Michael J. Horvath. Approved

Having completed all the business on the morning agenda, Brother President entertained a motion to adjourn for lunch, so moved by Supreme Director of Sports and Athletics, Kathleen S. Watkins, seconded by Supreme Physical Directress, Katie Swift.

SECOND SESSION Saturday, April 6, 2024 - 1:00 p.m.

The Supreme President called the Second Session to order and asked the Supreme Chaplain to open the session with a prayer.

President Glugosh then welcomed Allan Ferrone, CPS Actuaries, to present the **Actuarial Report.**

Mr. Ferrone presented the yearly report on the results of the Slovak Catholic Sokol's Annual Statement.

The Sokol assets now stand at just over ninety million.

Brother Ferrone reported on the operational results in 2023. The amount of money the Sokol collects from investment income and premiums is less than the money being paid out for benefits, insurance/fraternal expenses, dividends, and the amount needed to fund the required increases in reserves. Brother Allan indicated the Sokol needs to find ways to lower expenses and went over certain areas where change can affect operations in a positive way. The Home Office and Board will continue to find ways to lower expenses.

A discussion ensued regarding the operational results and areas where the Sokol can improve their efforts. Mr. Ferrone answered all questions to the satisfaction of the Board.

Brother President then called upon Mr. Thomas Calimano and Mr. Sean Rhoderick, of PNC Institutional Asset Management to present the **PNC Advisor's Report.**

Mr. Calimano began the meeting reviewing the last four years for the new Board. He then discussed the agenda which included a brief economic and financial market overview of 2023, expectations for 2024, and a portfolio / investment performance review. Mr. Rhoderick also discussed expectations for the Federal Reserve policy and the fixed income expectations.

Mr. Calimano and Mr. Rhoderick also discussed future potential portfolio repositioning and PNC's outlook for the financial markets during these challenging times.

Brother Calimano addressed various questions from the Board concerning our performance outlook. He indicated the Society is in a strong financial position, especially in this volatile fiscal environment.

Brother President asked if there was any **Unfinished Business** to address.

The Salary Committee updated the Supreme Secretary on the salary and goals for 2024. Brother Secretary will also update the Board on any changes regarding the Home Office Staff.

Thoughts from our Supreme Chaplain, Rev. Andrew S. Hvozdovic

WHY IS JUNE THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS?

June is known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus most simply because the solemnity of the Sacred



Heart is celebrated during this month. This year, the solemnity falls on June 7. The date changes each year because it is celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave, or the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost.

However, other reasons exist as to why June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

The feast dates to 1673, when a French nun who belonged to the Or-

der of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines) in eastern France began to receive visions about the Sacred Heart.

Jesus appeared to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque and revealed ways to venerate his Sacred Heart and explained the immense love he has for humanity, appearing with his heart visible outside his chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns.

These different ways include partaking in a holy hour on Thursdays and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month.

Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary: "My Sacred Heart is so intense in its love for men, and for you in particular, that not being able to contain within it the flames of its ardent charity, they must be transmitted through all means." These visions continued for 18 months.

On June 16, 1675, Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary to promote a feast that honored his Sacred Heart. He also gave Sister Margaret Mary 12 promises made to all who venerate and promote the devotion of the Sacred Heart. He said: "I ask of you that the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special feast to honor my heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to it by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the indignities which it has received during the time it has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that my heart shall expand itself to shed in abundance the influence of its divine love upon those who shall thus honor it and cause it to be honored."

Sister Margaret Mary died in 1690 and was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 13, 1920.

The Vatican was hesitant to declare a feast to the Sacred Heart, but as the devotion spread throughout France, the Vatican granted the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to France in 1765.

In 1856, Pope Pius IX designated the Friday following the feast of Corpus Christi as the feast of the Sacred Heart for the universal Church. Ever since, the month of June has been devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and his immense love for us all.

On the current calendar, the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a solemnity, the highest-ranking feast in the liturgical calendar, although it is not a holy day of obligation.
